

- Mobile sports wagering has its origins in remote account wagering.
- Remote account wagering was originally done via phone calls
- Prior to 1961, no federal laws directly applied to phone account wagering
- After 1961, only intrastate phone wagering could comply with federal law

- In 1972, Nevada first permitted sports pool and race book licensees to accept remote wagers on account
- Geo-verification was done via the telephone caller-id/switching system




The old phone system was a collection of devices and switches.

Each switch used incurred additional fees.


- Green to Yellow
- Green to Purple




- In the 1980s and 1990s the sports betting kiosk was created
- The kiosk connected to the book via a dial up modem
- Given the fixed location of the kiosks, geo-verification was easily achieved




- Demand for high speed data creates a better architecture for electronic communications called packet switching
 - Packet Switching breaks data into packets and sends it through the network in the most efficient way possible
 - Efficiency is determined by avoiding network congestion
 - Also, multiple devices can use common lines as lines can host packets from many different communications





- Without the traditional hierarchical switching system based on dedicated lines, long distance, even international long distance, largely becomes a thing of the past
- Network communications become global and accessible


- ► 1994 Antigua and Barbuda enact Free Trade & Processing Act
 - Permits online casino operations from their jurisdiction
 - Under the new law wagers
 placed with their operators are
 deemed to solely occur in
 Antigua and Barbuda



- ▶ 1996-2000s, "Off Shore" book handle soars:
 - Better pricing (no regulatory overhead)
 - Easy Credit
 - Anonymous computer access
- Systems are developed in Costa Rica & the U.K.
 - Often based on horse racing totalizer systems
- Coincides with a personal tech revolution

% of U.S. adults who ...



- 2001 Nevada enacts legislation to license interactive gaming
 - Casino gaming using remote account wagering
 - Internet, private cell, private cable...
- 2002 The U.S. Department of Justice issues a letter of warning to Nevada regulators
 - Deeming interactive gaming to be illegal under federal law.

- 2005 Nevada enacts Mobile Gaming statutes
 - Mobile gaming is interactive gaming confined to a casino premises



Rapid Bet Live receives approval to begin live field trial in Nevada

The Nevada Gaming Control Board's Technology Division has approved the first installation of the "wireless" version of Rapid Bet Live for a live field trial at the Palms Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas.

Rapid Bet Live allows live wagering throughout the entire course of a sporting event. The developer, Progressive Gaming International, received regulatory approval to distribute the "wired" version earlier this year. The "wireless" version will give patrons the flexibility of placing wagers on a mobile device from specific networked areas in the casino as well as playing from fixed terminals within the sports book.

"We believe casino operators' sports books will benefit from implementing both the 'wired' and 'wireless' versions of Rapid Bet Live by creating an exciting new sports book experience which will lead to incremental revenue growth opportunities," said Progressive Gaming CEO Russ McMeekin.

In separate news, FortuNet is the latest technology company, after IGT and Cantor, to win the approval of the Nevada State Gaming Control Board to become an operator of mobile gambling devices. The bingo device manufacturer said it will adapt its portable bingo devices to play other games.






HISTORY - THE CONFLUENCE OF EVENTS





LEGAL AND REGULATORY - HIGH LEVEL

LEGAL AND REGULATORY - CONCEPTUAL DIFFERENCES

Establish a Wagering Account in-person verification required Fund at Casino Kiosk or physical outlet Wager via window, kiosk, or mobile app outlet Re-fund at Casino Kiosk or physical outlet

MOBILE ENABLING IN-PLAY WAGERING

- Betting options happen too quickly for efficient window betting
- Risk management is key as margins are historically lower for in-play wagering
- Labor costs are also higher for managing risk
- Algorithms need constant review and revisions to manage risk
- In-play prop wagering costs are also higher due to the need for auditable data tied to prop wagering

NEVADA

- Mobile gaming has been the fastest growing method of wagering in Nevada over the last 4 years
- Margins for most bookmakers are lower for mobile than window betting, but volume for mobile betting is growing to dominate window betting
- Almost all Nevada bookmakers use some form of mobile or kiosk wagering

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

- Voice betting platforms (think Google Assistant, Microsoft Cortana, and Amazon Alexa)
- Play-by-play wagering
- New wagering opportunities
